DEADLINE: Applications must be complete and received by 1 April of the year of award. Applications can be forwarded anytime after 15 November but received no later than 1 April. If mid-year applications are accepted, application must be complete and received by 1 June and no later than 1 October of the year prior to award.

ANNOUNCEMENT DATE: Your Commander will be notified of your final status on/about 30 June.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The U.S. Army ROTC Green to Gold (GtG) scholarship program provides financial assistance for the education and training of highly qualified and motivated young men and women who desire to be commissioned as officers in the Army after graduation from college.

Soldiers are identified for this opportunity by their chain of command and their files are presented before a board of officers at Headquarters, U.S. Army Cadet Command (CC), for selection. Soldiers must meet basic eligibility requirements, including time in service, age, and medical qualification by the Department of Defense Medical Examination Review Board (DoDmerb). Beyond basic eligibility requirements, the board members look for the traits the Army desires in its officer corps, including scholastic aptitude, physical fitness and demonstrated leadership potential. Scholarships are not based on financial need but are awarded on merit. Merit is exhibited in academic achievement and extracurricular activities, such as sports, student government or part-time work.

The GtG program offers four, three and two year scholarships. Hip Pocket scholarships are 2-year GtG scholarships CC gives to Division and Corp Commanders to give to their Soldiers. CC verifies eligibility and the scholarship is awarded at the unit without competing during the National Board Selection Process. Enlisted members who have completed one year of college work toward their degree will be considered for 3-year scholarships. Those who have completed two years of college will compete for 2-year scholarships. Individuals who have not attended college or have four academic years remaining for a baccalaureate degree may compete for a 4-year scholarship. Enlisted members who have completed a baccalaureate degree and have no more than two years remaining to obtain a masters degree may apply for a graduate degree scholarship.

You may pursue any course of study leading to a baccalaureate or graduate degree listed in this application (Appendix A) and may engage in any campus/community activity that does not interfere with your requirements. Engineering and/or Nursing scholarship recipients must attend a school with an accredited Engineering and/or Nursing program. Nurse recipients are not authorized to change majors at any time.

In addition to your normal studies, Cadets must successfully complete the prescribed military science courses, Professional Military Education subjects, ROTC Leader Development & Assessment Course (normally between junior and senior years), and any other training that may be prescribed by the Secretary of the Army as a requirement for commissioning. Recipients of GtG scholarship Cadets are not permitted to participate in the Simultaneous Membership Program which permits simultaneous membership in both the Senior ROTC program and U.S. Army Reserve (USAR) or U.S. Army National Guard (ARNG). Upon successful completion of military science and degree requirements, Cadet will be commissioned as a Regular Army or U.S. Army Reserve Second Lieutenant in one of the officer accession branches of the U.S. Army. An individual's branch preferences and needs of the Army determine the branch received at the time of commissioning.

A U.S. Army ROTC scholarship will provide financial assistance toward college tuition and educational fees or room and board, whichever is chosen by the student. Additionally, a flat rate per year is provided to purchase textbooks, classroom supplies and equipment. The scholarship does not pay for aviation flight fees, room or board. Army ROTC scholarship winners also receive a tax-free monthly subsistence allowance of an annually published amount for up to 10 months a school year and are paid while attending ROTC Leader Development & Assessment Course.

Enlisted personnel who are accepted for the GtG program are discharged from Active Duty for the sole purpose of enrolling as an Army ROTC Cadet in the fall of the year of award. All Active Duty pay and benefits are terminated upon discharge. Credit for military service is not received while in ROTC. Recoupment of an unearned bonus is not required if the Soldier is separated to permit acceptance of a commission or warrant appointment or to enter a program leading to a commission or warrant appointment. Entitlement to additional

* unpaid bonus is suspended and will terminate upon commissioning or appointment. However, the entitlement to additional unpaid bonus will be reinstated and paid on a pro rata basis if the Soldier is not commissioned or appointed and returns to enlisted status in the same bonus MOS.

Terminal/transition leave is not authorized if enrolled in Army ROTC. Contracted ROTC Cadets are not authorized use of medical facilities or commissaries except during the periods in which they are attending ROTC Leader Development & Assessment Course.

Applicants may, if qualified, receive any portion of the Montgomery GI Bill/Army College Fund benefits they earned while on Active Duty (AD). To qualify for benefits under the GI Bill, active duty members must (1) Have received a high school diploma or equivalent prior to completion of their initial tour of active duty AND (2) Served at least 20 months on AD if initial obligation is two years; OR served 30 months on AD if initial obligation is three years or greater. The GI Bill is not required for participation in the GtG program. Applicants who request a discharge to enroll in ROTC cannot receive their GI Bill/Army College fund benefits if they have not completed the minimum length of active service before discharge. The GI Bill eligibility requirements are not waivable and contributions to the plan are nonrefundable. For further information, contact an education counselor at your installation's Education Center or visit the website at www.gibill.va.gov/education/benefits.htm or call 1-888-442-4551. The important point is to ensure you fully understand the benefits before making any decision.

The Army does not cover the expense of moving family and household goods from Soldier's actual permanent place of abode, home or army school to the educational institution they will be attending. Entitlement for the shipment of household goods is back to their home of record (HOR). If the cost to ship their goods to their school of choice is more than to ship to their HOR, the Soldier will be responsible for the difference.

If you change your address or wish to withdraw from competition after submitting your application, please notify U.S. Army ROTC Active Duty Scholarships, Fort Monroe, Virginia, immediately in writing to the above address or by E-mail to atecps@usacc.army.mil.

Applications on individuals who are not selected as recipients will not be carried over into the next cycle. Individuals must reapply for reconsideration.

OBLIGATIONS

If medically and administratively qualified and selected for the GtG program, Soldier will be required to -

1. Initiate DA Form 4187 (Personnel Action) requesting a discharge under provisions of AR 635-200, (Active Duty Enlisted Administrative Separations), chapter 16, paragraph 16-2b(1)(f), thru their Commanding Officer and the Personnel Administration Center (PAC) to the approving authority. Discharge should be requested and approved in sufficient time to allow applicant to arrive on campus, normally 30 days, prior to fall enrollment.
2. Sign a contract (Army Senior ROTC Scholarship Cadet Contract, DA Form 597-3) with the Secretary of the Army.
3. Enlist in the U.S. Army Reserve in the grade of Cadet for assignment to the USAR Control Group (ROTC) for a period of eight years.
4. Accept an Army commission as an Active Army, U.S. Army Reserve or U.S. Army National Guard officer upon completion of the required academic and ROTC courses.

5. Serve in the military for a period of eight (8) years. This may be fulfilled by serving on Active Duty for (4) years followed by service in the U.S. Army Reserve, U.S. Army National Guard or the Inactive Ready Reserve (IRR) for the remainder of the eight year obligation or serving eight years in an USAR or ARNG Troop Program Unit which includes a three to 12- month Active Duty period of initial training.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Read instructions carefully and print or type the information required. It is the Soldier's responsibility to ensure that all required forms are submitted to U.S. Army ROTC Green to Gold Active Duty Scholarships, Fort Monroe, Virginia. Incomplete or inaccurate files will not be forwarded to the ROTC Scholarship Selection Board for review. It is important for the Soldier to retain a copy of all paperwork submitted.

Applications must be completed and received by CC anytime after 15 November but no later than 1 April of the year of award. Scholarships must start in the Fall semester; they cannot be deferred to begin the following Spring semester. After CC's review of completed packet, the Commander will be informed of the Soldier's status as a winner (qualified, conditional-medical or conditional-administrative) on or about 30 June. The award of scholarship becomes final when nominee is medically qualified and has no administrative issues unresolved.

Two-year Hip Pocket scholarship applications must be completed and received by CC no later than 1 April of the year of award. If nomination requires waiver approval, the earlier the package is submitted, the better chance the applicant has of getting all approvals required in time to start school that semester. By 1 April, CC also needs a memorandum from the Commander listing their nominations. There is no board process, the Commander's recommendation is sufficient. Upon nomination, the Soldier becomes a conditional winner. After CC's review of completed packet, the Commander will be informed of the Soldier's status as a winner (qualified, conditional-medical or conditional-administrative) on or about 30 June. The award of scholarship becomes final when nominee is medically qualified and has no administrative issues unresolved.

Discharge is a local action between the Soldier, Professor of Military Science (PMS) at the college of choice and the counterpart battalion. It is the Soldier's responsibility to ensure that all required forms are submitted to the college and the counterpart battalion for review. The counterpart battalion needs to be contacted early, as they are responsible for verifying eligibility and administering the enlistment oath for the PMS at the school where the Soldier will attend. In addition to the forms submitted in the application mailed to CC, the counterpart battalion must also have verification of citizenship and proof of social security number. You cannot be discharged until all enrollment eligibility is met. Counterpart battalions are Kansas State University, 785-532-6754/5172, for Fort Riley, Kansas, and University of Kansas, 785-864-3311, for Fort Leavenworth, Kansas.

Should you have questions or desire assistance in completing your scholarship application, you may contact a ROTC unit located near your installation. These units are listed in this packet. If you are stationed at a site outside the Continental United States, your local education center may provide assistance in completing your application. If you have questions that cannot be answered through your education center you may call a GIG point of contact listed in this packet. You may also visit the web site www.rotc.usaac.army.mil (Scholarships/Green to Gold) for additional information.

GETTING DISCHARGED

Soldiers will not initiate discharge procedures until fully qualified administratively and medically qualified. Discharge should be requested and approved in sufficient time to allow time to arrive on campus for registration, normally 30 days, prior to fall enrollment. Terminal or transition leave is not authorized.

When fully qualified (medically and administratively), Soldier must initiate a DA Form 4187 (Personnel Action) requesting a discharge under the provisions of AR 635-200, chapter 16-2 (Active Duty Enlisted Administrative Separations), through their Commanding Officer and Personnel Administration Center (PAC) to the approving authority. Attachments must include a copy of the final notification letter from CC, letter of acceptance from Professor of Military Science (PMS) from the school Soldier plans to attend, letter of acceptance from school stating that Soldier is accepted as an academic freshman, sophomore, junior or graduate student, proof of enrollment from school, copy of approved DoDMerb medical examination, current copy of Enlisted Records Brief, and copies of approved waivers (request for waivers must be submitted along with the application), if applicable. Soldier must not have any action pending IAW AR 600-8-2 (Suspension of Favorable Personnel Actions (Flags)).

The Commander will sign an endorsement and enclose it with the DA Form 4187 to be forwarded through the Brigade Commander. When approved by Brigade, it is forwarded to PAC to out-processing, who will cut discharge orders. DD Form 214 (Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty) should indicate a Reenlistment Code (RE) of 1. Separation authority personnel should contact Headquarters, Cadet Command at 757-788-3770 or DSN 680-3770 if they have any questions. One day prior to being discharged, the Soldier will be administered the oath and sign the ROTC contract at the counterpart battalion or GiG Liaison. The date of enlistment will be dated effective the day after discharge. Whether a Fort Riley Soldier plans on attending Kansas State University (K-State) or a school other than K-State, they must provide K-State ROTC with all the required paperwork necessary to be contracted and discharged to include the letter of acceptance from the gaining school. K-State ROTC must also have verification of citizenship and proof of social security number as they will be responsible for contracting the Soldier in order for them to be discharged. Soldier cannot be discharged until all enrollment eligibility is met.

Soldiers who submit a GiG packet and subsequently come down on Permanent Change of Station (PCS) orders may submit a DA Form 4187 requesting a deferment of orders until the results of the scholarship board are released. Submit the request through normal command channels.

Soldier must attend the institution which provided the Planned Academic Program Worksheet (CC Form 104-R). Those who desire to attend a school other than the one which provided the initial CC Form 104-R must submit a subsequent CC Form 104-R to CC and the counterpart battalion or GiG liaison, verifying academic status, to include a letter of acceptance from school stating that Soldier is accepted as an academic freshman, sophomore, junior or graduate student, and letter of acceptance from the PMS prior to accepting the award and discharge. The Planned Academic Program Worksheet must be signed and authenticated by the Soldier and the academic advisor. If Soldier is determined to be ineligible or fails to enroll in school and ROTC, they will be returned to Active Duty to fulfill their service commitment. Changing of schools between discharge and contracting will not be authorized. Note: If you wish to claim Kansas as your residence and be charged in-state tuition, you must apply within 30 days of discharge to the admissions office at Kansas State University.

Scholarship recipients will be required to pursue an undergraduate or graduate degree in the academic discipline indicated by the university on the Planned Academic Program Worksheet. Changing of academic discipline will not be authorized unless approved by PMS. If applicant is pursuing Engineering or Nursing degree, they must attend a university with an accredited Engineering or Nursing program. Nurse recipients are not authorized to change majors at any time.

ELIGIBILITY CHECKLIST

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Meet basic eligibility requirements listed in AR 635-200, chapter 16-2 (Enlisted Personnel); AR 145-1 (SROTC Program: Organization, Administration and Training); CC Reg 145-1 (Army ROTC Scholarship Policy, Administrative and Procedural Instructions); CC Reg 145-6 (ROTC Green to Gold Prospecting); and CC Pam 145-4 (ROTC Enrollment, Retention and Disenrollment Criteria, Policy and Procedures). Must not be ineligible IAW AR 145-1, chapter 3.

CITIZENSHIP

Be a citizen of the United States. Nonwaiverable.

AGE

Must be under age of 31 on 31 December of the year you will complete all requirements for a commission and a college baccalaureate or graduate degree. If applicant turns 31 after 31 December of the commissioning year, they can receive scholarship benefits. However, if applicant turns 31 on or before 31 December in the commissioning year, they are ineligible to receive scholarship benefits. There is no extension for military service. This is a statutory requirement and there are no waivers authorized.

SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER

Verification is required.

TIME IN SERVICE

I have completed a minimum of two years of Active Duty for an initial enlistment (waiverable) and not have 10 years or more of active federal service as of the date of discharge (waiverable). You must be able to serve on active duty for 20 years with 10 years of active service as a commissioned officer in order to retire from active duty as an officer. You must also understand that you may be released upon completion of 20 years of Federal Service and may not be eligible to retire as an officer. If waiver is approved, you must sign, date and have witnessed an 'acknowledgement statement' which will be placed in your Military Personnel Record Jacket and Official Military Personnel File upon commissioning. You must also complete three months of AD for every one month of specialized training received (e.g., Language training, Critical Military Occupational Skill (MOS), Airborne, Air Assault) you will have received an Additional Skill Identifier (ASI) or Special Skill Identifier (SSI) with your MOS as of date of discharge. Service obligations are served concurrently; the most recent service obligation for specialized training may not be based on the most recent course attended. Longer duration ASI/SOI courses may have service obligations that override a shorter but more recent course.

Cadet Command is not the approving authority of time in service or service obligation waivers; this can only be done by Human Resource Center (HRC)-Alexandria, Virginia. If a waiver for time in service is required, Soldier must submit the request for waiver through CC to HRC, along with the application. CC will forward the DA Form 4187 (Personnel Action) (example at Appendix H) to HRC with scholarship award information upon award of scholarship.

If a waiver of the Time in Service or Service Obligation for training is required, Soldier must submit the request for waiver through CC to HRC with the scholarship application. Determine waiver requirements using worksheet (Appendix H). CC will forward the DA Form 4187 (Personnel Action) (example at Appendix H) to HRC with scholarship award information upon award of scholarship.

PRIOR ENLISTMENT

If previously enlisted and discharged from any service, DD Form 214 (Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty) with Reenlistment Code (RE) included, DD Form 220 (Active Duty Form), NGB Form 22 (Report of Separation and Record of Service) or memorandum from training site which indicates dates of attendance at training, if applicable. If Soldier was released with a disqualifying RE code, a waiver must be requested. Contact CC about waiver procedures. Requesting a waiver does not ensure approval.

RECOMMENDATION FROM IMMEDIATE COMMANDING OFFICER AND FIELD GRADE OFFICER

Commenting on Soldier's officer-like qualifications, i.e., leadership potential, appearance, personality, military record and aptitude for further military training. CC Form 173-R (Application for U.S. Army ROTC Green to Gold Scholarship Application) (Appendix B) will be used. This form is signed by the Soldier, Military Personnel Office (MILPO), Commanding Officer, and Field Grade Commander. The Company Commander must also list Soldier's Scholar-Athlete-Leader-(SAL) requirements in their recommendation. SAL information and checklist (Appendix G) are listed in this application. If not a favorable recommendation, Soldier is ineligible.

PHOTOGRAPH (Appendix C)

Application must include a recent full length Department of the Army photograph in Class A uniform taken within the last three months. If deployed, provide a snapshot in ACUs/BDUs along with a copy of the deployment orders. Not required if applying for a Hip Pocket scholarship. Affix photograph to CC Form 103-R (Active Duty/Reserve ROTC Applicant Snapshot) (Appendix C). The photograph will be retained by CC.

ARMY PHYSICAL FITNESS TEST (APFT)

Must pass a record APFT and achieve a minimum score of 180 or higher with a minimum of 60 points in each event (no alternate events) within six months of application, discharge and contracting. Nonwaiverable. Current height/weight IAW AR 600-9 (The Army Weight Control Program) must be indicated and verified by Commander. If Soldier does not meet screening table weight, a current Body Fat Content Worksheet must be included in the application.

HEIGHT/WEIGHT STANDARDS

Meet height and weight standards IAW AR 600-9 on date of application, discharge and contracting. If Soldier does not meet screening table weight, a current Body Fat Content Worksheet must be included in the application. Nonwaiverable.

CURRENT TRUE COPY OF ENLISTED RECORDS BRIEF (ERB)

A current true copy of your ERB is required which will verify citizenship, marital status, time in service, General Technical score, etc. Must be verified and signed by MILPO.

GENERAL TECHNICAL (GT) SCORE

Must have a minimum GT score of 110 or higher on the GT Aptitude Area of the Army Classification Battery. A Soldier may retest through their installation education center. Nonwaiverable.

MEDICAL EXAMINATION (Appendix D)

Be medically qualified IAW AR 40-501, Chapter 2, (Standards of Medical Fitness), for participation in the ROTC program as determined by the Department of Defense Medical Examination Review Board (DoDmerb). You can forward a medical examination if it is less than 24 months old or accomplish a new physical IAW AR 40-29 (Medical Examination of Applicants for ROTC Scholarship Program) using DD Form 2351 (DoDmerb Report of Medical Examination) and DD Form 2492 (DoDmerb Report of Medical History) (Appendix D).

If no previous medical physical is available, have your Commanding Officer/First Sergeant contact the unit's supporting medical treatment facility and request they accomplish a physical IAW AR 40-501, Chapter 2. In addition, DD Forms 2351 and DD Form 2492 (Appendix D) must be used. When completing DD Form 2351, enter 'ADEP' in block 8 along with the Soldier's current mailing address and in the top hand corner of DD Form 2492. This will prevent the medical examination from getting lost and delaying medical qualification.

If any additional tests or evaluations are required for final medical determination, DoDmerb will return the packet to Soldier at their unit of assignment. You must be fully medically qualified for a scholarship PRIOR to discharge. If you are applying for the 2- year Active Duty Option Program (ADOP) in addition to the 2- year scholarship and awarded the ADOP, you must be medically qualified by 15 July of the year of the award or you will be deferred until the following semester.

Medical examinations must be submitted at the time of application or no later than 30 days after submitting the application packet. CC will forward the physical to DoDmerb with the appropriate form for processing as an Army ROTC GIG scholarship applicant. Do not send the physical yourself to DoDmerb. Delay in forwarding physical could result in your not being medically qualified in sufficient time to be released from the Army for fall enrollment. The physical qualification process normally takes DoDmerb anywhere from 6-8 weeks from start to finish. Any remedials or follow-up required by DoDmerb should be accomplished by you prior to announcement of selections. CC will forward the qualified physical to Soldier's battalion.

Medical examinations must be submitted at the time of application to CC, (ATCC-OP-I-S) (Green to Gold Scholarships), Fort Monroe, Virginia, or no later than 30 days after submitting the application packet. CC will forward the physical to DoDmerb with the appropriate form for processing. Do not send physical directly to DoDmerb. Delay in forwarding physical could result in not being medically qualified in sufficient time to enroll in the program. The physical qualification process normally takes DoDmerb anywhere from 6-8 weeks from start to finish. Any remedials or follow-ups required by DoDmerb should be accomplished prior to announcement of selections.

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATE

Must be a high school graduate or the equivalent.

OFFICIAL HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT

Four-year scholarship applications must include official transcript of high school attended. Files with partial transcripts will not be considered by the selection board.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA) (HIGH SCHOOL)

Four-year scholarship applicants must have a cumulative high school GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 grading scale. Use of weighted GPA is not authorized. Waiverable.

OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS OF ALL COLLEGES ATTENDED

Application must include all official transcripts of all colleges attended. College grade reports are not transcripts and are unacceptable. Transcripts that appear in languages other than English must be translated prior to submission. If you have received college credit by means of the USAFI or CLEP tests, official results of such tests must also be furnished to CC. Soldiers are responsible for ensuring that all official transcripts are enclosed in their packet. Files with partial transcripts will not be considered.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA) (COLLEGE)

Three-, 2-year and Hip Pocket applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 point grading system on all previous college work completed. The school accepting you for attendance should establish a GPA. If a cumulative GPA has not yet been established at the institution where applicant is enrolling, the PMS must ensure that all grades associated with academic credit hours accepted by the gaining school are used to compute an entrance GPA. If you attended Kansas State University and are applying to attend K-State under this program, the GPA K-State has established will be the GPA used in your packet. Courses and credit hours transferred in will not be included in K-State's grade point average. If you have received college credit by means of the USAFI or CLEP tests, official results of such tests must also be furnished to CC. Use of weighted GPA is not authorized. Waiverable.

SCHOLASTIC APTITUDE TEST (SAT) OR THE AMERICAN COLLEGE TEST (ACT)

Four- and 3-year applicants must have a minimum SAT score of 920 (composite of Verbal and Math) or ACT composite score of 19. For applicants applying for a 3-year scholarship with one full-time college semester completed with a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or greater do not have to have an SAT/ACT. Since 3-1/2 applicants are boarded with 4- year applicants, proof of SAT or ACT must be submitted. If scheduled to take the SAT or ACT examination, use SAT code 0454 or ACT code of 1676 when you complete the registration forms to have scores automatically sent to CC. If you take both the SAT and ACT, furnish the results of both tests to CC. Results must be received by 1 April prior to fall enrollment. Any other college board tests taken other than SAT or ACT are unacceptable (e.g. CEEB, etc.). Not required if applying for a 2-year or Hip Pocket scholarship. Waiverable.

UNIVERSITY LETTER OF ACCEPTANCE

Must be from a baccalaureate degree producing college or university offering Army ROTC indicating that applicant has been unconditionally accepted as an academic freshman, sophomore, junior or graduate student, as applicable, and the school start date. If the letter does not indicate the academic class or the school start day, you must call the school and ask them for a letter that does state it. If school does not provide a full acceptance, applicant is ineligible. For the three- and 2-year scholarship, if you are undergoing academic studies and have not attained sophomore or junior status (whichever is applicable) at the time of application to a school, the letter may state that applicant is conditionally accepted pending final completion of current studies. A follow-up letter and CC Form 104-R indicating your status will be required prior to selection in May.

EVALUATION OF CREDITS

If you will be attending a college/university other than the one from which you obtained your college credits, an evaluation of credits is required which should include course number and title, course grades, credit hours attempted and earned toward the degree pursuing and grade point average, if available. Some university systems may accept transfer credit for placement purposes and still require additional evaluation by the department awarding the degree. This may change your academic status. It should also indicate applicant's status as an academic freshman (4-year scholarship), sophomore (3-year scholarship), junior (2-year scholarship and Hip Pocket) or graduate student (2-year scholarship). For the three- and 2-year scholarships, if applicant is undergoing academic studies and has not attained sophomore or junior status (whichever is applicable) at the time of application, the evaluation may state that they are pending final completion of current studies. A follow-up letter and Planned Academic Program Worksheet (CC Form 104-R) indicating status will be required prior to selection in May. The evaluation must also state start date of semester the applicant will attend and registration dates. If applicant is accepted into a graduate program on a conditional basis, i.e., pending passing of first two classes, then he/she is not fully qualified and cannot be discharged to participate in this program.

PROFESSOR OF MILITARY SCIENCE (PMS) LETTER OF ACCEPTANCE

Must be accepted by the PMS into the ROTC program applicant is seeking enrollment. Contact the PMS at the institution in order to receive this letter. Letter should verify academic status, confirmation of medical qualification and start date of term or semester in which applicant would be scheduled to begin classes.

PLANNED ACADEMIC PROGRAM WORKSHEET (CC Form 104-R) (Appendix E)

(Not required if applying for a 4-year scholarship). CC Form 104-R (Appendix E) indicating academic status indicating academic status and that applicant has three (3-year scholarship) or two (2-year, Hip Pocket or Graduate scholarship) years remaining as a full time student to degree completion. The PMS at the institution applicant plans to attend will assist them in the completion of this form. If the school they plan to attend does not host Army ROTC, they must have the school official forward the form to the Army ROTC host institution with which a partnership school agreement in ROTC is authorized. It must be completed and signed by a university advisor. Transfer hours accepted by the school you will be attending toward the degree you intend to pursue must be included on this form, block 5.b. and confirmed by school administration through evaluation of transcripts. Course overloads and summer sessions are not authorized. Verification form must indicate that applicant has been accepted in the academic discipline indicated on application. Applicants must attend the institution which provided the CC Form 104-R. Applicants who desire to attend a school other than the one who provided the initial CC Form 104-R must submit a subsequent CC Form 104-R verifying academic status, letter of acceptance from the college, and the letter from the PMS to CC for approval prior to accepting the award and discharge. Changing of schools between discharge and contracting will not be authorized. Scholarships are awarded to the school you applied to and cannot be used at any other school without CC approval.

UNIFORM CODE OF MILITARY JUSTICE (UCMJ) OR CIVIL CONVICTIONS

Cannot be under probation of a civil conviction or have charges pending at time of application. IAW Lautenberg Amendment Gun Control Act of 1968, cannot have a misdemeanor record of a Domestic Violence Conviction. Convictions of any domestic violence crime are nonwaiverable.

Applicants who have had an adverse adjudication (e.g., pay a fine, attend classes, perform community service or perform any other similar acts), or have been arrested, indicated, or convicted by a civil court of military law for other than minor traffic violations are ineligible unless waived. If applicant has been found guilty of a minor traffic offense and the fine (to exclude court costs) is \$250 or less, a waiver is not required except in alcohol or drug-related driving offenses or when they have accumulated six or more such offenses within a 12 month period or if during the previous three years, they were convicted or received an adverse disposition for 12 or more minor traffic offenses. Requesting a waiver does not ensure approval.

- * The waiver request must be submitted with application. Include a complete written affidavit (Appendix 1) with the description of the offense, to include all circumstances leading up to arrest and conviction and complete sentence imposed, copy of the court record which indicated the charge, plea, and/or findings, as well as the sentence imposed and the record showing satisfaction of the sentence (when court records are not available this fact must be established by correspondence from the court) and three recent letters of character reference which indicate that the writer is aware of your specific situation requiring a waiver. Your statement must be certified under oath. If an offense occurs after you submit your application up to date of discharge you must also inform CC and request a waiver.

DEPENDENCY

Applicant must have no more than three dependents (spouse and two children under the age of 18). A waiver may be processed for a married applicant with more than three dependents (spouse and three or more children under the age of 18). If applicant has more than three dependents, a waiver is required. Contact CC about waiver procedures. Requesting a waiver does not ensure approval.

An applicant without a spouse and one or more dependents under 18 years of age is ineligible unless a waiver has been requested and approved. A dependency waiver may also be processed for an unmarried applicant when the child or children has/have been placed in the custody of the other parent, an adult relative or legal guardian by court order and the applicant is required to provide child support. Applicant must sign a statement of understanding that they will be disenrolled should they regain custody of the child or children while enrolled in ROTC. DA Form 3286-31-R, (Statement of Understanding U.S. Army Enlisted Policy for Applicants Without Spouse Who Have Surrendered Custody of Dependents), will be used as a guide. An exception to the disenrollment will only be considered if extraordinary circumstances prevail such as the death of the legal guardian or adult. Contact CC about waiver procedures. Requesting a waiver does not ensure approval. Note: A Soldier married to an Army National Guard member with a dependent but said Soldier has not adopted the dependent means he/she has no dependent and is eligible.

An unmarried applicant may be processed for enrollment when child or children has/have been placed in the custody of the other parent, an adult relative or legal guardian by court order and the applicant is not required to provide child support. Applicant must sign a statement of understanding that they will be disenrolled should they regain custody of the child or children while enrolled in ROTC. DA Form 3286-31-R, (Statement of Understanding U.S. Army Enlisted Policy for Applicants Without Spouse Who Have Surrendered Custody of Dependents), will be used as a guide. An exception to the disenrollment will only be considered if extraordinary circumstances prevail such as the death of the legal guardian or adult. No waiver is required. Copies of court documents must be provided with the application.

An applicant without a spouse and one or more dependents under 18 years of age is ineligible unless a waiver has been requested and approved. Contact CC about waiver procedures. Requesting a waiver does not ensure approval.

A dependency waiver may be processed for an applicant with a spouse in a military component of any armed service (excluding members of the Individual Ready Reserve) who has one or more dependents under 18 years of age. Contact CC about waiver procedures. Requesting a waiver does not ensure approval.

DRUG AND/OR CHEMICAL SUBSTANCES

Applicants who admit to limited experimental use, which occurred over six months prior to discharge and/or enrollment, are eligible without a waiver. Those admitted to limited, experimental and/or recent use (i.e., within the last six months) are ineligible without waiver. Applicants who admit to frequent and/or habitual use prior to entry into the program are ineligible without a waiver. Contact CC about waiver procedures. Requesting a waiver does not ensure approval.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT (CC Form 228-R) (Appendix F)

Reflects financial status after military separation. Must be verified and signed by Company Commander.

SCHOLAR-ATHLETE-LEADER (SAL) (Appendix G)

The selection board will evaluate your potential for becoming an officer with quality indicators based on the SAL model. A Soldier may be 100% qualified and eligible to contract and commission, but without meeting any of the SAL criteria he or she is not likely to be awarded a scholarship. Each applicant must complete the SAL checklist (Appendix G) located in this application and work with their chain of command to indicate or highlight all SAL qualities in the file submission to enhance the strength of their application. The Company Commander must list Soldier's SAL requirements in their recommendation letter.

Scholar

- Honor Graduate/Commandant's List of NCOES school
- For two-year scholarship applicants, either cumulative GPA over 3.0 on all college level courses or if 25% of the course work is in Math, Science, Engineering or technical courses, cumulative GPA over 2.7
- For four- or 3-year scholarship applicants, cumulative high school GPA over 3.0 and SAT/ACT over 1100/21
- For four- or 3-year scholarship applicants, top third of class and either:
 - Cumulative GPA over 3.0 or SAT/ACT over 1100/21

Athlete

- Score 270 or higher on APFT with a minimum 90 points in each event
- Active competitive involvement on post level or higher sports team
- Placement in top three of individual athletic competition (triathlon, mountain biking, running, martial arts, etc.)

Leader

- Selected as Soldier/NCO of the Quarter/Year at battalion level or higher
- Served in team leader/squad leader position for minimum of six months with favorable endorsement from Company Commander
- Inducted into the Sergeant Audie Murphy/Sergeant Morales Club
- For four- or 3-year scholarship applicants, any of the following:
 - Elected member of student government, class and/or activity
 - Captain of athletic or academic team
 - Eagle Scout/Gold Award

ROTC GREEN TO GOLD ACTIVE DUTY OPTION PROGRAM MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) (Appendix K)

(Required only if also competing for the 2-year GtG Active Duty Option Program)

Memorandum of Understanding (Appendix K) will be signed by Soldier and a witness and included in the application packet. You will be considered for this program if block 3a on CC Form 173-R (U.S. Army ROTC Green to Gold Active Duty Option Program Application) is annotated 'yes'. If block 3a is annotated 'no,' you will be considered for the GtG ROTC Scholarship Program only. A Soldier may be considered for both programs by selecting 'yes' for both programs; however, if selected, they will have to choose either AD option or Scholarship option. Eligibility criteria for the Green to Gold Active Duty Option Program is at Appendix M.

NCO EVALUATION REPORTS (DA FORM 2166-8) / SERVICE SCHOOL ACADEMIC EVALUATION REPORT (DA FORM 1059) / AWARDS

Applicants in the rank of SGT or above must submit copies of the last two (2) DA Form 2166-8 (NCOERs) received and a copy of latest DA Form 1059 (Service School Academic Evaluation Report). Applicants in the rank of SPC/CPL or below must submit copies of the last three (3) awards and/or DA Form 1059 (Service School Academic Evaluation Report) received, if applicable.

ENTRANCE NATIONAL AGENCY CHECK (ENTNAC)

Have a favorable or have initiated an ENTNAC or National Agency Check (NAC). Applicant is ineligible if they had a security clearance that has been denied, suspended or revoked. If it is determined that a security clearance will not be granted after enrollment in the program, Soldier will be removed and reassigned based on the needs of the Army at their current enlisted grade/rank and MOS.

CONSCIENTIOUS OBJECTOR

Can not be a conscientious objector IAW AR 600-43 (Conscientious Objection). Can not have any moral obligation or personal conviction that will prevent applicant from supporting and defending the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and domestic or conscientiously bearing arms. Nonwaiverable.

FLAGGED

Must be eligible to reenlist and have a waiveable reenlistment (RE) code. Applicant can not be under suspension of favorable personnel action IAW AR 600-8-2 (Suspension of Favorable Personnel Actions).

PRIOR ROTC CADET

If a prior ROTC Cadet, cannot be ineligible for reenrollment in ROTC basic or advanced course IAW AR 145-1, chapter 3, paragraph 3-3 (Senior Reserve Officers' Training Corps Program: Organization, Administration, and Training). Prior 4-year winners whose scholarship terminated/disenrolled during their freshman year and prior Marine, Navy, or Air Force scholarship Cadets may be able to compete. This information must be mentioned as part of the application and will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

MEMBERS OF SISTER SERVICES

Members of sister services (Marines, Navy, Air Force) are not eligible for a GtG scholarship. Warrant Officers are also not eligible for GtG. There are other avenues for Warrant Officers to obtain their commissions.

DISCHARGE DATE

Must be on Active Duty 1 June of the year applicant intends to attend college. If not, applicant is ineligible. Terminal leave cannot be taken in conjunction with early discharge IAW AR 600-200 (Enlisted Personnel Management System). Discharge normally will not take place more than 30 days before the starting date of the school semester.

SIMULTANEOUS MEMBERSHIP PROGRAM (SMP)

Applicant may not participate in SMP that permits simultaneous membership in both the Senior ROTC program and U.S. Reserve or U.S. Army National Guard.

APPLICATION DOCUMENTS

APPLICATION FOR U.S. ARMY ROTC GREEN TO GOLD 4-, 3- AND 2- YEAR SCHOLARSHIP (CC Form 173-R). This form is signed by Soldier, MII, PO, Commanding Officer, and Field Grade Commander.

A Soldier selected to participate in this program will not be considered for the GtG Active Duty Option Program. However, if block 3a is annotated 'yes,' the Soldier will be considered for the program. If block 3a is annotated 'no,' the Soldier will be considered for the Green to Gold ROTC Scholarship Program only. A Soldier may be considered for both programs by selecting 'yes' for both programs; however, if selected, the Soldier will have to choose either the Active Duty option or the Scholarship option. Eligibility criteria for the Green to Gold Active Duty Option Program is at Appendix M.

ACTIVE DUTY/RESERVE ROTC APPLICANT SNAPSHOT (CC Form 103-R) (Four-, 3-, and 2-year scholarship). Affix a recent full length Department of the Army photograph in uniform taken within the last three months. If deployed, provide a snapshot in BDUs along with a copy of the deployment orders. Print name and social security number on back of the photograph.

ARMY PHYSICAL FITNESS TEST SCORECARD (Record) (DA Form 705) Must have achieved a score of 180 or higher with a minimum of 60 points in each event (no alternate events) within the last six months. Current height/weight IAW AR 600-9 must be indicated and verified by Commander. If Soldier does not meet screening table weight IAW AR 600-9, a current Body Fat Content Worksheet must be included in the application.

CURRENT TRUE COPY OF ENLISTED RECORDS BRIEF (ERB) This will verify citizenship, marital status, time in service, General Technical score, etc. Must be verified and signed by MILPO.

MEDICAL EXAMINATION Medical examinations must be submitted at the time of application to CC or no later than 30 days after submitting the application packet. CC will forward the physical to DoDMerb with the appropriate form for processing. Do not send the examination directly to DoDMerb. Delay in forwarding physical could result in not being medically qualified in sufficient time to enroll in the program. The physical qualification process normally takes DoDMerb anywhere from 6-8 weeks from start to finish.

OFFICIAL HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT (Four-year scholarship; not required for three-, 2-year or Hip Pocket scholarships). Application must include official transcript of high school attended. Files with partial transcripts will not be considered by the selection board.

OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS OF ALL COLLEGES ATTENDED Application must include all official transcripts of all colleges attended. College grade reports are not transcripts and are unacceptable. Transcripts that appear in languages other than English must be translated prior to submission. If you have received college credit by means of the USAFI or CLEP tests, official results of such tests must also be furnished to CC. Files with partial transcripts will not be considered.

RESULTS OF SAT OR ACT (Four-, and 3-year scholarship; not required for 2-year or Hip Pocket scholarships). Applicants must have a minimum SAT score of 920 or ACT composite score of 19.

UNIVERSITY LETTER OF ACCEPTANCE from a baccalaureate degree producing college or university offering Army ROTC indicating that applicant has been unconditionally accepted as an academic freshman, sophomore, junior or graduate student, as applicable, and school start date.

EVALUATION OF CREDITS If attending a college other than the one from which applicant obtained college credits, an evaluation of transfer of credits is required. Evaluation should include course number and title, course grades, credit hours attempted and earned toward the degree pursuing and grade point average.

PROFESSOR OF MILITARY SCIENCE LETTER OF ACCEPTANCE accepting applicant in the Army ROTC program verifying their academic status.

PLANNED ACADEMIC PROGRAM WORKSHEET (CC Form 104-R) Three- year scholarship applicants must indicate on CC Form 104-R three years remaining (six semesters) as a full-time student to degree completion. Two- year, Hip Pocket and Graduate applicants must indicate two years remaining (four semesters) as a full-time student to degree completion. It must be completed and signed by a university advisor. Not required if applying for a 4-year scholarship.

COPY OF WAIVER REQUESTS (civil conviction, dependency, grade point average, ACT/SAT, re-enlistment eligibility code or time in service, etc.). if applicable. Waiver requests must be included with application. Requesting a waiver does not ensure approval.

- Following are documents and/or information required to apply for a waiver.

Civil Conviction: The waiver request must be submitted with your application. Include a complete written affidavit (Appendix I) with the description of the offense, to include all circumstances leading up to arrest and conviction and complete sentence imposed, Copy of the court record which indicated the charge, plea, and/or findings, as well as the sentence imposed (your statement must be certified under oath) and the Record showing satisfaction of the sentence (when court records are not available this fact must be established by correspondence from the court) and Three recent letters of character reference which indicate that the writer is aware of your specific situation requiring a waiver. If an offense occurs after you submit your application up to the date of discharge you must also inform this headquarters and request a waiver.

Dependency: Statement from applicant requesting a dependency waiver; Monthly financial statement (must show your ability to meet dependency financial obligations (after being discharged) throughout participation in ROTC. Take into account any court ordered support, medical coverage or payment obligations and reality-based estimates of living expenses. It should not show your current military salary, but finances to be earned after discharge and it must also show housing costs after moving off post and medical care and insurance for dependents when it is no longer provided by the military); Court custody decree/divorce decree, if applicable, medical support should not require applicant to remain on current enlistment; Dependency Statement of Understanding (CC Form 132-R) (Appendix J); and/or copy of Family Care Plan if spouse is currently on Active Duty, you are a Sole Parent or part of an ROTC Couple. Contact CC for further information.

Grade Point Average and/or ACT/SAT: Waiver requests will be accepted in the form of a memorandum with justification from the Soldier and/or Company Commander.

Re-Enlistment (RE) Eligibility Code: A statement from applicant requesting a re-enlistment eligibility code; Complete written description (affidavit, certified under oath) of the circumstances; Evidence of the removal of hardship condition, if appl; If for medical reasons, DD Form 2351 (DoDmerb Report of Medical Examination) stating condition. Examining and reviewing physician statement must address conditions which resulted in disqualifying RE code; Copy of disqualifying medical examination or Medical Waiver Review Board results and current medical examination showing condition no longer exist; In case of TDP/EDP, copy of separation proceedings and correspondence. Contact CC for further information.

Time in Service: Provide CC with a copy of DA Form 4187 (Personnel Action), From: Immediate Commander; Through: Headquarters, U.S. Army Cadet Command, ATTN: Green to Gold Scholarship (ATCC-OP-I-S), 55 Patch Road, Building 56, Fort Monroe, VA 23651-1052; To: Commander, HRC, ATTN: AHRC-EPT, 200 Stovall Street, Alexandria, VA 22332, requesting a waiver with the application which will be forwarded to AHRC-Alexandria with scholarship award information upon award of scholarship and clearance of all medical and administrative conditions.

Training Service Obligation: Provide CC with a copy of DA Form 4187 (Personnel Action), From: Immediate Commander; Through: Headquarters, U.S. Army Cadet Command, ATTN: Green to Gold Scholarship (ATCC-OP-I-S), 55 Patch Road, Building 56, Fort Monroe, VA 23651-1052; To: Commander, HRC, ATTN: AHRC-EPT, 200 Stovall Street, Alexandria, VA 22332, requesting a waiver with the application which will be forwarded to HRC-Alexandria with scholarship award information upon award of scholarship and clearance of all medical and administrative conditions.

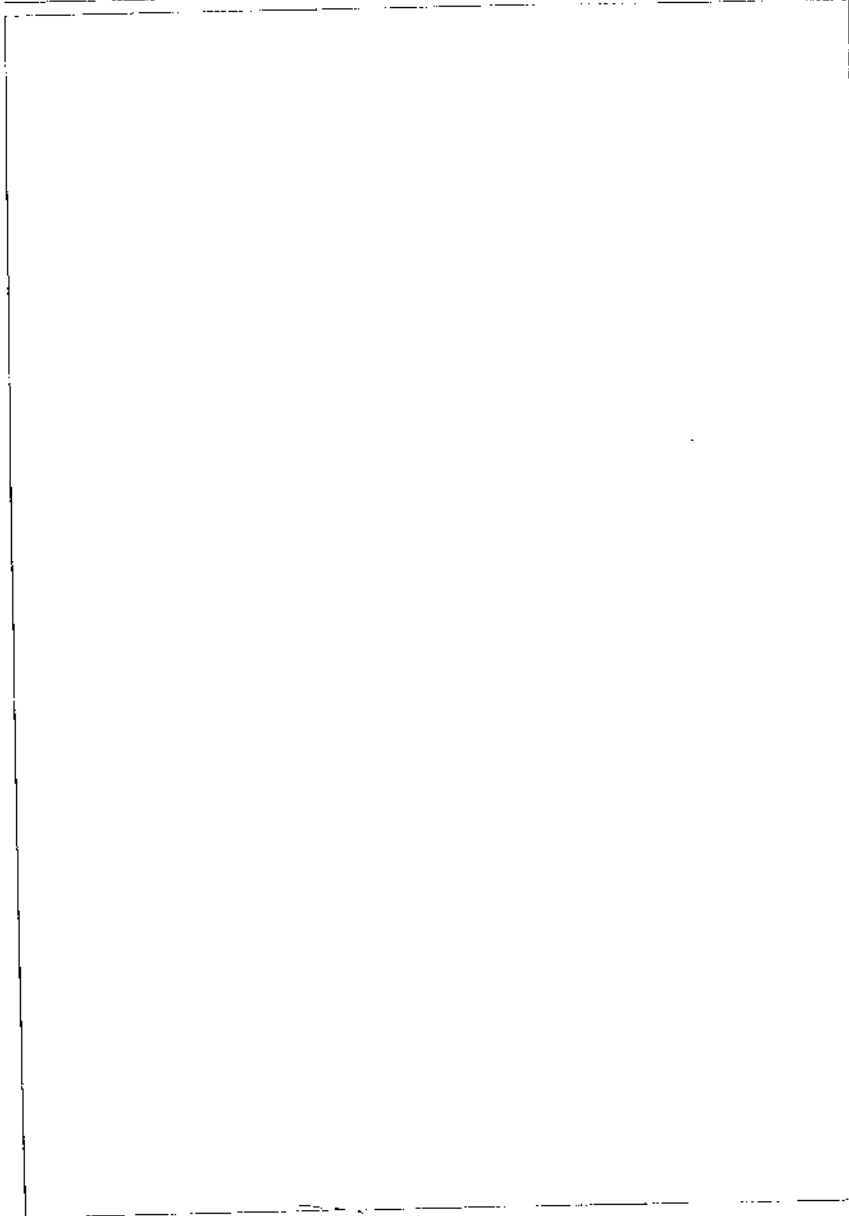

This applies to Soldiers who attend service schools in a PCS, TDY pending further orders (TDYPO), TDY en route, or TDY and return status. It also applies to those who attend functional courses, seminars, and so forth, at civilian institutions (on a contract or reimbursable basis) for training not available in the service school system and where no other established service-remaining requirement exists. Soldiers who do not meet the service-remaining requirement must be processed in accordance with AR 601-280, paragraph 4-6, before they comply with orders directing movement to the school.
- b* Service-remaining obligations for Soldiers who recycle for academic or disciplinary reasons, or who voluntarily recycle, will be computed from new course completion date. Extension of enlistment will be accomplished under AR 601-280 prior to restart of training.
- c* Service-remaining requirements for Soldiers who complete training but do not possess required security clearance for award of CMF 18 will be computed from the date MOS is awarded. This does not apply if delay in granting of required security clearance can be attributed to processing delays.
- d* The amount of service-remaining requirements will not be changed for students who meet prerequisites at the beginning of a course and are recycled through no fault of their own. Approval must be obtained from HRC (AHRC-EPR) for reclassified Soldiers (or Soldiers who have re-enlisted for retraining) prior to placement in the next available course. Enlistment commitments will be honored without any additional service-remaining requirements.
- e* Soldiers selected for additional schooling under special training programs before completing basic training (BT) or AT must meet the service-remaining obligation prescribed by the regulation for that program.
- f* The required amount of the service-remaining requirement will be computed from the completion date of the course. When Soldiers are selected to attend two or more successive courses, the combined course lengths will be added to obtain the total service-remaining requirement. This combined amount will not exceed 36 months. Service-remaining requirements will be based on the course length shown in table 4-1, unless otherwise stated. Soldiers eligible to, but refusing to take action to satisfy the service-remaining requirements must be processed in accordance with AR 601-280, paras 4-11 and 4-12.
- g* Soldiers attending the following NCOES courses will incur a 6-month service-remaining obligation upon graduation:
- (1) Basic Noncommissioned Officers Course (BNCOC).
 - (2) Advanced Noncommissioned Officers Course (ANCOOC).
- h* Soldiers attending the following courses will incur a 24-month service-remaining obligation upon graduation:
- (1) U.S. Army Sergeants Major Course (USASMC).
 - (2) Training associated with entry into and award of a CMF 18 MOS. Soldier must be able to serve 24 months active duty in a CMF 18 MOS duty position upon completion of MOS training (including completion of any required language/specialized skill training).
 - (3) Training associated with entry into and award of a CMF 37 MOS. Soldier must be able to serve 24 months active duty in a CMF MOS duty position upon completion of MOS training (including completion of any required language/specialized skill training).
- i* Soldiers attending the following courses will incur a 36-month service-remaining obligation:
- (1) Middle Enlisted Cryptologic Career Advancement Program (MECCAP).
 - (2) Military ELINT Signals Analyst Program (MESAP).
 - (3) Military Intern Sigint Analyst Program (MINSAP).
 - (4) Training associated with MOS 15R, 15S, 15T, 68J, or 15X (excluding ASI Q2 training).
 - (5) Training associated with MOS 25B (Information Systems Operation Analyst).
 - (6) ASI N2 Nondestructive Test Specialist Course.
- j* Soldiers attending the Battle Staff Course will incur a 12-month service-remaining obligation upon completion of training.
- k* Soldiers attending the Apprentice Special Agent Course (ASAC) will incur a 60-month service-remaining obligation upon completion of training. This 60-month SRR only applies to the ASAC; other SRRs are governed by paragraph 4-6f and table 4-1.
- l* RA Soldiers who will become eligible to retire under Section 3914, Title 10, United States Code (10 USC 3914) or 10 USC 3917, must agree to meet their service-remaining requirements to attend the selected course. Soldiers will be required to sign a statement before movement to the school acknowledging that they have been informed that voluntary

retirement will not be approved until the required service is completed after either graduation or termination of class attendance. (See AR 635-200, para 12-9c).

m Soldiers in the ARNGUS and USAR units on active duty who are selected to attend service schools must sign an agreement that they will remain on active duty to complete the course although their units may be released from active duty earlier.

n Soldiers scheduled for training as a result of participation in the BEAR program must be extended for the number of months stipulated in AR 601-280, chapter 6, prior to departure for training.

Our friends' parents were out of town. Everyone seemed to be having a good time and some of the graduating seniors who looked older used some fake ID to get a couple of kegs of beer. Though my teammates and I knew better, we decided to go ahead and each had a couple of beers. We thought we would just hang around for a little bit and then leave.

The party started to get really loud about 11:30 PM and my friends and I thought it might be a good idea to leave. We each had a beer in our hand. Just about then we saw police car lights flashing through the living room windows. I said that we had better get out of the house through the back door. If we were caught it meant that we would be kicked off the team and placed on suspension from school. We ran out the back door and went around the corner to where my car was parked. We didn't think to throw the beers away but threw the cans down on the floor of the back seat and half covered them with a jacket. In my hurry to leave, I squealed my tires. That must have gotten the attention of one of the police officers as we were met two blocks away by another police car that stopped us. I was told by the officer to get out of the car. When I was standing behind the car, the officer shined his flashlight into the car and saw the beers. He then told my friends to get out of the car. We were taken in police cars to the police station. I was given a breathalyzer test, which registered .10. I was charged with driving under the influence and with being a minor in possession of alcohol. My teammates were also charged with minor in possession. They charged approximately 75 students with various offenses at the party, which included most of the senior class, some juniors, and a few sophomores.

Due to the backlog created, my case was not heard by a judge until June 2001. I pled guilty and was given the fine stated above as well as having to pay court costs and attend a nine-week class. The fine and court costs were paid on 18 June 2001 and I completed class on 9 October 2001. Additionally, I was required to sit out the 1991 football season and was placed on probation by the school superintendent for one term. My past record of school activities was taken into account and I was allowed to come back to the football team.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN

SUBJECT: ROTC Green to Gold Active Duty Option Program Memorandum of Agreement

I. I have been accepted for participation in the ROTC Green to Gold Active Duty Option Program. I agree to maintain all regulatory requirements of the ROTC program, to include (but not limited to the following):

a. **FULL-TIME STUDENT AGREEMENT.** I agree to remain a full-time student in good standing at the following educational institution, _____ until I receive my degree. A full-time student is defined as one enrolled in sufficient academic courses to receive a degree within 4 semesters or 6 quarters. This includes the required Army ROTC classes, which may be part of or in addition to those courses required for my degree. I agree to remain enrolled in and successfully complete the ROTC program, including Leadership Development and Assessment Course (LDAC) and all training as prescribed by the Secretary of the Army or his/her designee, as a prerequisite for commissioning.

b. **ACADEMIC GRADE POINT AVERAGE AGREEMENT.** I agree to maintain, at a minimum, a cumulative academic grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 or equivalent scale. This grade point average must also be maintained for each semester or quarter. If I am required by my academic major or by the school I am attending to maintain a higher cumulative and semester or quarter grade point average, I agree to maintain that higher standard until the completion of the academic requirements for my degree. I understand and agree that failure to maintain the minimum academic grade point average may subject me to disenrollment from the GtoG ADO program and necessitate my return to the Army in my previously held enlisted rank.

c. **ROTC COURSES GRADE POINT AVERAGE AGREEMENT.** I agree to maintain at least a 3.0 on a 4.0 or equivalent scale, cumulative and semester or quarter academic grade point average in all ROTC courses. I understand and agree that failure to maintain the minimum ROTC courses grade point average may subject me to disenrollment from GtoG ADO program and necessitate my return to the Army in my previously held enlisted rank.

d. **MEDICAL AND PHYSICAL FITNESS STANDARDS.**

(1) I agree to maintain eligibility for enrollment and retention in ROTC and for commissioning, as defined by statute, Army regulation, and this MOA, throughout the period of this MOA.

(2) I agree to meet and maintain the Army Physical Fitness Test (APFT) standard and the screening weight or body fat percentage required by the Army Weight Control Program as required of active duty soldiers. These will be continuous requirements that I must continue to meet until the date that I report to Officer Basic Course (OBC) and thereafter. Commissioning eligibility standards, including the APFT and Army Weight Control Program standards, are subject to change, and I must keep myself informed of such changes through contact with the IMS. I understand and agree that failure to maintain the weight and physical fitness requirements may subject me to disenrollment from the GtoG ADO program and necessitate my return to the Army in my previously held enlisted rank.

(3) I agree to undergo precommissioning drug and alcohol screening tests, normally administered during LDAC training, or as may otherwise be prescribed by U.S. Army Cadet Command. If the result of any test is positive, I will be subject to disenrollment from the GtoG ADO program and necessitate my return to the Army in my previously held enlisted rank.

(4) I agree to undergo testing for HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus) antibody during my precommissioning physical examination, normally during LDAC training or as the U.S. Army Cadet Command may otherwise prescribe. If the result of the testing is confirmed positive, I will be disenrolled from the GtoG ADO program and necessitate my return to the Army in my previously held enlisted rank.

DISCLOSURE OF DISQUALIFYING CONDITIONS. By executing this MOA, I represent that I meet all eligibility criteria for participation in the GtoG ADO Program and commissioning, as defined by statute, Army regulation, and this MOA. I represent that I have disclosed any and all pre-existing medical conditions and non-medical conditions that would make me ineligible for enrollment in the ROTC program as specified in statute, Army regulations (including but not limited to, AR 145-1) and this MOA. Failure to have disclosed or to disclose any disqualifying condition, including any conditions I should have known about, will subject me to immediate release from the ROTC program and reassignment based on the needs of the Army. I certify that I have been notified of the Department of Defense Homosexual Conduct Policy, and I understand that my sexual orientation does not make me ineligible for contracting with the Army. Therefore, nothing in this paragraph requires a disclosure of my sexual orientation in violation of the Department of Defense Homosexual Conduct Policy as addressed in AR 600-20

f. NATURE OF DUTIES AND CONSCIENTIOUS OBJECTOR STATUS. My acceptance of the terms and conditions of this agreement signifies my readiness to bear arms, to engage in and support combat operations and to operate and support operations of approved weapons systems. If I at any time apply for conscientious objector status, I will be disenrolled from the GIG ADO program and be reassigned return to the Army in my previously held enlisted rank.

g. CADET OBLIGATION.

(1) I understand and agree that I will incur an active duty obligation upon entry into the program.

(2) If I am disenrolled for any reason, I understand that I will be required to serve any unexpired portion of my previous statutory enlistment obligation. The unexpired portion of my previous statutory enlistment obligation runs concurrently with my contractual military service obligation under this agreement.

2. I understand that the active duty obligation for participation in the program is four years. I further understand that the minimum service obligation as a commissioned officer is three years.

3. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR 2- YEAR GtG ACTIVE DUTY OPTION PROGRAM

A soldier selected to participate in the Green to Gold Scholarship Program will not be considered for the GtG Active Duty (AD) Option Program. However, if block 3a on CC Form 173-R (U.S. Army ROTC Green to Gold Active Duty Option Program Application) is annotated 'yes,' soldier will be considered for the program. If block 3a is annotated 'no,' the soldier will be considered for the GtG ROTC Scholarship Program only. A soldier may be considered for both programs by selecting 'yes' for both programs; however, if selected, they will have to choose either AD option or Scholarship option.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The GtG AD Option Program provides eligible, active duty enlisted soldiers an opportunity to complete a baccalaureate or graduate degree and be commissioned as Army officers upon receiving appropriate degree. This program allows soldiers to enter ROTC program as academic juniors or graduate students and requires that they graduate within 24 months (only under unique circumstances and approved by CC this may be extended up to 24 months). Soldiers who are selected will continue to receive their current pay and allowances while in the program (up to 24 consecutive months or a maximum of 24 months if an extension is approved by CC). Failure to graduate on time will result in a cadet's return to AD and forfeiture of the opportunity to commission.

No soldiers participating in the GtG AD Option Program will be allowed ROTC scholarship benefits to pay for tuition. They will either use the benefits of the Montgomery GI Bill, outside scholarships, or pay for tuition as an out-of-pocket expense. Soldiers are not eligible for tuition assistance because they are full-time students.

ROTC GtG AD Option Program Memorandum of Understanding (Appendix K) will be signed by soldier and a witness and included in the application packet if you are also competing for this program. If selected and upon entering the ROTC program, cadet will sign a Memorandum of Agreement between PMS and GtG AD Option Cadet (Appendix L) that outlines details and obligations of participation in the program.

ADDITIONAL ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

AGE Must be young enough that applicant will not be 30 years old or older at the projected time of commissioning. Waiver requests for participants over 30 years of age will not be supported except for nursing students or individuals with outstanding qualifications. Waivers are normally not granted to an applicant who will exceed 35 years old at time of commissioning. The processing of waivers will be submitted at time of application by Cadet Command. Requesting a waiver does not ensure approval.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE Must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 point grading system on all previous college work completed. Nonwaiverable.

TIME IN SERVICE Must have completed a minimum of two years of Active Duty for an initial enlistment (nonwaiverable) and not have 10 years or more of active federal service at time of graduation/commissioning (waiverable)

You must also complete three months of AD for every one month of specialized training received (e.g., Language training, Critical Military Occupational Skill (MOS), Airborne, Air Assault) you will have received an Additional Skill Identifier (ASI) or Special Skill Identifier (SSI) with your MOS as of date of discharge. Service obligations are served concurrently, the most recent service obligation for specialized training may not be based on the most recent course attended. Longer duration ASI/SSI courses may have service obligations that override a shorter but more recent course. Waiverable. Requesting a waiver does not ensure approval.

Must have at least 48 months remaining upon entering program. Soldiers who do not meet service remaining requirement must be processed IAW AR 601-280 (Army Retention Program), para 4-6, before complying with orders directing movement to U.S. Army Student Detachment, Fort Jackson, SC. A soldier is ineligible if they have less than 48 months remaining on their current enlistment contract and are unable to extend current service obligation. Nonwaiverable.

OBLIGATION

Soldiers who are medically and administratively qualified and selected to participate in this program will be required to serve in the military for a period of eight (8) years. This will be fulfilled by serving on AD three (3) years followed by service in USAR, ARNG or IRR for remainder of eight-year obligation. Reserve Component duty is not authorized.
